EAI BY THE NUMBERS

- An average of 14,103 people visited the website each month
- 283 New Group Information Packets were sent out
- The Board of Trustees met 14 times
- 146 individual donors gave 286 contributions
- 40 groups switched over to virtual meetings
- 36 new groups formed
- 15 scholarships for materials for new groups were provided
- 61 orders were sent free to prisoners
- 6 people received free materials thanks to contributions to the hardship fund.

FINANCIAL SYNOPSIS - PAUL N., TREASURER

Sales from literature, which typically make up two thirds of EAI's sales, fell 9% this year. Increased sales of our new workbook, *Welcoming The Spiritual Awakening Within Me*, were more than offset by declines in traditional book sales. On a positive note, donations increased approximately 8% while operating costs remained steady over the prior year. These factors in the aggregate led to a \$24,000 operating deficit. However, due to the organizations ability to attain financial relief via the CARES act, the net loss was reduced to \$8,711 for the year. As costs are concerned, the organization is as thinly stretched as it can be in order to be able to effectively produce and distribute literature and respond to information requests from new and existing members.

In the coming year, it is unlikely that the organization will be able to attain further financial relief from the government. That means that without substantial increases in literature purchases and donations, EAI will run out of money in three to four years. This would be devastating for the entire membership that relies on a well-functioning central office to conduct all of the functions that are necessary to facilitate the nearly 700 EA groups worldwide.

As we approach EAI's 50th anniversary, I implore everyone who can to give a little more each month to bring the organization back to viability and ensure that it remains with us all for a long time to come.
